## 2016 US Scale Masters Championships Woodland/Davis California.

This was the second time that we have had the opportunity to host this event. The first was in 2013 and now three years later the 37th annual version is now in the books. Started in 1980, by a small group of southern California scale squadron modelers, the event was patterned after the Masters Golf tournament event which invites its attendees through a qualifier system. Wins and placements at regional events would qualify modelers around the country for the Championships, held annually in the fall each year. The event has ranged all over the United States and often includes some international participation.

The event kicked off on Thursday with arrivals, registration, practice flying and mostly a lot of static judging. Our own Jim MacDonald and Rich Geertson toiled for the day studying models to separate the best of the best. Jim has handled Craftsmanship judging many times over and I find his sharp eye and experience as a modeler to be a plus. Rich has judged at the qualifiers many times for me and now for the second time at the championship event on the outline category. Nothing gets by Rich. Color and Markings were judged by Roxanne Cottrell, who came from the Phoenix area to mix it up a bit. Models in the expert and team categories are judged against a 100 point standard. Most scores are in the nineties, and we even had a 100 at this event from an amazing Grumman Ag Cat.

Flying commenced on Friday. We fought some wind that came up throughout the day on Friday, but everyone flew round one and only a few had to stand down for the afternoon round 2. A hangar party that was sponsored by the folks that bring you Zap Glue was held at the hotel on Friday night. A good time was had by all! Saturday morning brought perfect weather, light breezes, cool temperatures and lots of flying. Two more rounds were flown before everyone cleaned up and headed off to the banquet. We had a guest speaker, local pilot who has done good- Red Jensen. Red is a native of Santa Rosa, model pilot and designer, pylon racer, sailplane guy, and now chief pilot at NASA. He highlighted the work that he does at NASA with models to improve the state of controlled flight and pilot safety. Of particular interest was technology pioneered with models that allowed an aircraft to take over control after pilot loss of consciousness. He showed video of happening showing that the pilot was saved within one second of crash. He also brought a couple of NASA artifacts including a Gemini space craft hand control thruster gimbal which flew in space, and must have contained a 500 machined parts. He also brought a Mach meter from the Bell X1 flown by Chuck Yeager to break the sound barrier. Yes, that Mach meter!

Sunday dawned with the threat of showers and wind. We hustled and got the flying done with one squall that came though. Brad Osborne of Southern California got caught the worst and flew almost a whole flight through his rain streaked glasses with his PT 19. He didn't have the luxury to remove them; he told me he couldn't see 6 feet in front of himself without them! We then tallied the awards and presented some prizes. Our own Alex Garza won the KMP P47 raffle, which was pretty awesome. He came by my house last night and picked it up and he was excited. Maybe a new scale pilot in the midst. Our own Forrest Barton took 4th Place in Pro AM Pro category, with Jack Diaz SR in 2nd and Jack Diaz Jr in 1st.

In Expert, Chris Wolfe of San Diego won with his electric Mirage III jet. He flew very well and deserved to win. I can recall when the first electric powered model flew at the Masters in 1990 and it was a cub type that staggered around for 5 minutes until its battery died. Chris' Mirage is a real departure from those old days. My Lockheed T33 missed the first two rounds due to a bad flap servo that had to be fixed. Using my only three flights on Saturday and Sunday I was able to get close but could not catch Chris. I was .16 points behind Chris in second. My dad Dave was 6th and local her Daryl Rolla was 7th and received pilots choice.

Everyone has gone home now and the event is a memory, but I had so many people complement our field, our club, the welcoming atmosphere and expressed their sincere appreciation for the efforts put forth by the members of our club that I felt it important to share.





The performance was a WWII tribute, starting with Pearl Harbor (which included an Aichi D3A Val replica), and ended with the dropping of atomic bombs on Japan (and an accompanying Wall of FIRE). It was a truly moving performance when one considers how many young lives were terminated all too quickly during that horrendous conflict - while standing in the realization that SO FEW WWII combatants (people and flying machines) remain today...



A pair of our newest U.S. strike fighter, the F-35 "Lightning," were on display, but did not fly. I was not aware that the F-16 has been upgraded and the newest variant is called the "Viper" (not the fighting Falcon). I still

find the F-16 to be one incredible fighter. Fast, agile, and great fun to watch fly!

There were plenty of beautiful vintage civilian aircraft as well as military transport aircraft on display. Other than a short rain squall that lasted perhaps 30 minutes, the weather was fantastic and the flying was constant.

The Blue Angels were, as always, SUPERB and it was such a great thing to see them performing again!

The VIP tickets we purchased were worth every penny and the whole event was first class.
