July 8, 2019 Board Meeting Minutes

Board Members/Officers present: President: Kerry Roberson, Vice President: Doug Vice, Treasurer: John Eaton, Secretary: Mike Frint. Board Members: Doug Barton, Sheldon Berkowitz, Mike O'Kane, Danny Winters. **Absent:** Board Member: Chris Dellinger, Safety Officer: John Lett.

The meeting, held at the Woodland Public Library, was called to order by Doug Vice at 1812 hours. The meeting started with eight members present and ended with a total of eleven. No guests or new members.

A motion was made by Kerry to approve last month's Board meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mike O. and adopted.

Officer Reports:

<u>President:</u> Kerry stated that some work on the power project was done last week. Our new pole is installed but the new P.G. and E. pole is not. P.G. and E. is waiting for us to have our pole ready before they remove their old pole and put a new one in. Doug added that we have all the supplies now and we had to dig a hole five feet deep for the new pole to be "certified."

<u>Vice President:</u> Doug had nothing to report.

Secretary: Mike has (finally) got the Milt DeGroot memorial plaque installed at the field. Unfortunately the plaque for Richard McWayne popped off and needs to be reinstalled. Funny thing is, he has a picture from March 2013 of it being glued down the first time. We don't know who that member is in the picture. We get these plaques from All Action Awards in Woodland and they aren't cheap.

<u>Treasurer/Membership:</u> John came in late at 1819. Kerry presented him money from the Wings of Victory event. John stated we spent five hundred dollars to rent the auger to put in the new power pole. John did not have the financial statements so next month will give us a double report. John has issued 93 membership cards this year. Tonight should make that 94.

Old Business: Water supply/pumps/electrical-more-Doug V. asked if we needed a drawing to get the permit. John said we don't get one from P.G. and E. but Ken Hook has done one. Mike O. stated it was included in the application process. Doug V. asked for clarification about the pump and electrical boxes. The pump bearings will be

changed when the pump is moved. A short discussion ensued about P.G. and E.'s payment methods. **Shade structure**-Mike O. wants to get more dimensions from the Woodland Christian School's structure. He asked John for a contact number and how to get prices for metal from the supplier.



<u>Upcoming Events:</u> August 3 is the Golden Age event. The Goyet control line stunt meet is August 24-25. Doug B. said that if the water project isn't ready then we may need to cancel the event. Helicopter Scalemasters 2020: Mike O. gave the date of May 7-9 to Forrest for the event calendar. Mike asked if we needed to vote on it. Mike O. then made a motion that we approve these dates for 2020. The motion was seconded by Doug B. and approved with no opposition.

Other New Business: Sheldon reports that the pit area tables are "tired" and need work. Danny Winters had done work on them several years ago. It seems we need to do it again. Mike O'Kane brought in a box of transmitters that he wants to sell.

Art reduced the rudder throw and sure enough, veered off the runway and damaged the center wing section/landing gear and nacelle areas. Art has since put it back to the throw recommended by the kit instructions.

Show and Tell: None. Lou Fox brought in some stuff to give away. Mike O'Kane has a bunch of transmitters he is trying to sell. Doug Vice had a video on his phone from the Balsa Model Aircraft Builders Facebook page that showed some scale modern functional avionics in the cockpit of a scale model.

Other: Lou Fox is moving to a new home and has a Tough Shed type building that he would like to donate to the club.

This year's Golden Age of Aviation fly-in was held Saturday August 3rd at Woodland Davis Aeromodelers. The flying weather was excellent, albeit pretty hot, and we had 10 registered pilots. The golden age theme was well-represented with a nice assortment of aircraft from the era, including some very unusual models rarely, if ever, built and flown.

Dave Lovett's Northrop Gamma certainly falls under the heading "rare" and it was quite a treat to see it flown so many times. Another I had never previously seen was Larry Sutherland's Douglas O-46





reconnaissance plane.

With my affinity for Aeronca's, it was great to see a 1/3 scale C-3, a.k.a. "Flying Bath Tub" courtesy of Scott Allen. Other stand-outs were Robert Stanley's TravelAir Mystery Ship and John Grigsby's Stinson Reliant, built from the Top Flight kit. John's Stinson was powered by a Saito 60cc triple gasser and seemed















like an ideal powerplant for this gorgeous aircraft.

It is gratifying to see continued interest in this aircraft era and I recognize and appreciate the time and talent required to build and fly some of these challenging designs. Ben Ponzo was Pilot In Command of the grill (again) this year and his efforts to keep hungry pilots well-fed and hydrated is always very much appreciated!

In years past, I have awarded a Pilot's Choice "Best Golden Age," but more recently have diverted a portion of the \$10 landing fee towards lunch being included.

Where? - Gold Country Flyers flying field, lone, CA located on Michigan Bar Road between Hiway 16 and the City of lone. Note that Michigan Bar Road (aka lone Road) is currently closed. See detour instructions on the back of this flyer.

When? - Starts at 7:00 AM until?

Food? - Yes, there will be food at a nominal cost.

We will allow flying as soon as it seems safe to fly. All swap meet attendees are welcome to fly at our field that day (you MUST have an AMA card WITH YOU).

For all those new and long time attendees of the Gold Country Swap Meet, there is a major change this year. The lone Road (AKA Michigan Bar Road) off of Highway 16 (AKA Jackson Highway) is currently CLOSED due to a bridge replacement. There is a detour available which adds very little time to your journey to our flying field.

First of all, if you normally get to our flying field by driving through the town of lone, or by coming from Highway 99 from the direction of Galt on Highway 104, nothing has changed. You will see many signs about lone Road (AKA Michigan Bar Road) being closed to thru traffic. Just drive round those signs and proceed to the flying field as you always have.

If you are traveling to the swap meet on Highway 16 (AKA Jackson Highway) from Sacramento, Rancho Murrieta or other points West; or you are traveling to the swap meet on Highway 16 (AKA Jackson Highway) from Plymouth, Placerville or other points East, there is a quick and easy detour.

For those traveling from Rancho Marietta, Sacramento and other points West on Highway 16 (AKA Jackson Highway) will have to detour by driving past lone Road approximately 5 miles and turn right onto Forrest Home Road.


For those traveling from Placerville, Plymouth and other points East on Highway 16 (AKA Jackson Road) will have to detour by turning approximately 5 miles before getting to lone Road by turning left onto Forrest Home Road.

Continue approximately 1.1 miles then turn right onto Carbondale Road.

Continue approximately 3.5 miles then bare to the left to remain on Carbondale Road.

Continue approximately 1.9 miles - Carbondale Road dead ends into Michigan Bar Road. Turn right.

Continue approximately 0.6 miles then the Gold Country Flying Field will be on the left.




