Minutes

The March meeting was called to order by President Monty Pate at 7:00 PM.

Secretary-Treasurer Report. Jim MacDonald reported that the AMA rechartering has been completed. There were several members that he was unable to contact and confirm their AMA status, so they were not included on the club roster forms. Everyone was asked to please examine the membership list sent out in February. If there are any blanks next to your name, contact Jim and provide the needed information. We must have complete records. It was also pointed out that AMA now requires clubs to list the age of all members on the club rosters. Please provide that information as well.

Everyone should now have new keys for the field gate, and last years keys should be turned in. If you do not turn in your old key, you will be required to pay a "key fine" before you can renew your membership for next year. This is to offset the cost of having additional keys made every time we "recycle" a lock set.

Jim MacDonald reported that he had just received a letter from the Yolo County Tax Assessor indicating that our use of the flying field was viewed as a "Possessory Interest," and that our club was therefore liable for payment of property taxes. The amount of tax was substantial and Jim was given responsibility for following up on the matter with the county and city governments (progress report elsewhere in the newsletter).

Vice President Report. Lee Helsel indicated that organizers had been lined up for our various club events this season.

It was suggested that the July club meeting be held at the flying field where we could have a Bar-B-Que. Featured speakers for the May and June meetings will be Bob Sieglekoff (C/B Associates) and Jerry Nelson (Circus Hobbies).

Lee also announced that the Air Show Team (Capitol City Barnstormers) was undergoing reorganization. Lee Helsel is the new team manager. The team is incorporating and also undergoing some changes in philosophy.

Field Chairman. Harold Buchholtz reported that our equipment is safe, but the rest of the field is completely flooded.

The guest speaker at our February meeting was George Steiner, who gave an excellent talk on "Servo Maintenance." George indicated that servos should be periodically checked for problems in wires or plugs, wear in the gears or output shaft, and smooth response to transmitter commands.

George estimated that 80% of all servo problems were the result of dirty feedback pots and show-ed people how they should be cleaned. Briefly, you need to open the case to expose the elec-tronics (save the foam pads). Mark the posi-tion of the feedback pot in the case and then remove it. The pot element should be cleaned remove it. The pot element should be cleaned with alcohol and scoured with a pencil eraser. The wiper should be cleaned with alcohol on a Q-tip. Metal wipers should be lubricated with a small amount of "pot lube" (available from Ace Products). Carbon wipers should not be lubed. The wiper fingers should be adjusted to provide a small amount of tension contact with the not after which the pot is prime. with the pot, after which the pot is reinstalled in the case and the servo recentered.

As is always the case with most RC projects, progress ebbs and flows with the current of life events... Long-time friend (and WDA Lifer) Ken Martin stayed with us for a couple of weeks in March so he could perform two very specialized medical procedures at Children's Hospital, Oakland. Ken is now retired and living in Florida, but remains one of only a handful of physicians with the skillset required to perform a very specific procedure, so he came out of retirement (briefly) to intervene for his







former colleagues. While he was here, we spent time FLYING, rather than building... although we did complete some fiberglassing on the underside of the Skyrocket wing and fuselage top-side.

The aircraft pictured (left) is my 33% Xtreme Decathlon, built from Wendell Hostetler plans (and a laser cut short kit). Power is a DA120. I'm sure you will agree that SMOKE adds A LOT to any aerobatic maneuver. Have you ever thought about adding smoke to your aircraft? There are many good articles on how to do it, so I won't try to re-invent the wheel here... however, there are some

things you should know, going in, that may save you some headaches (I know from bitter experience) \sim **Decathlon photos courtesy of John Garfein**





First, you will need smoke muffler(s), a smoke pump and smoke fluid. Where most of us run into trouble is the type of tubing used to connect to the smoke mufflers. While the black "high temperature" style of tubing is recommended, I have had nothing but bad luck with that stuff. Oh, it works... for awhile... until it cracks at the attachment point... at which time you pump smoke fluid all over your engine and inside of the cowl. The tubing with which I have had best experience is Sullivan's PRO FLEX.

This is now my go-to for ALL fueling needs as it is impervious to gas, glow, diesel, smoke oil, AND HEAT.

The first smoke pump installed in my Decathlon - Sullivan Sky Writer - failed for no apparent reason. I replaced it with another pump system that seemed to have developed a mind of its own... it would pump smoke oil, and then it wouldn't..?

Thinking I had another pending pump failure, I took everything apart so I could operate the system outside the airplane. Thankfully, I was able to duplicate the intermittent problem and believe I found the cause... The pump is rated at "7.4v nominal @ 0.9 amps" I had switched all my airborne batteries from LiPos, to LiFe batteries. While far less volatile than LiPos, LiFe batteries have a lower nominal voltage of 6.6v. When fully charged, the smoke pump would operate SOME of the time, but once the LiFe battery's peak output dropped, the smoke pump stopped working. As you can imagine, this was frustrating, leading me to believe I had yet another smoke pump failure. Nah... just me using the wrong voltage to drive the pump.

The OTHER big concern when using smoke is the aircraft's FINISH. They don't call it "smoke oil" for no reason... and this oil goes everywhere. Optimally, you want to set up your system to pump just the right amount of oil which can be burned at any given throttle setting, but you will still end up with unburned smoke oil on your aircraft. Iron-on plastic coverings WILL eventually succumb to the oil. The best finish is gel coat (as in Composite airplanes). Next best is painted, preferably a paint that resists fuel and oil. My Decathlon has the STITS finish applied, which is impervious to both. **Smoke** is, after all, just another on-board gadget with the potential for failure and the need for



maintenance, but when it's working, the effect is AWESOME!

While Dr. Ken was here, we also ran my Saito 90cc 3 cylinder radial. It had been sitting for a couple of years since it's initial break-in runs. Not surprisingly, it started right up and ran GREAT! This engine is slated for a Jerry Bates F4F-3 Wildcat, which was begun YEARS ago, but pushed aside due to delays in getting the scale Robart gear operational, then in deference to other projects. When I first began the Wildcat project, with the Saito triple in mind, I had KELEO make a scale exhaust for my application. The exhaust stacks exit in the scale location on the plane and the sound of the engine is vastly improved over the stock, Saito, flexible exhaust tubes that come with the engine.

Until the Skyrocket is DONE, the Wildcat remains on deck. Rich Geertson
