Sherry Berletich Pumpkin Roll

Beat 3 eggs on high speed 5 minutes. At 1 cup sugar gradually, 2/3 cup pumpkin, and 1 tsp. lemon juice. Set aside. Add

Stir together: 3/4 C flour 1 tsp. baking powder 2 tsp. cinnamon 1 tsp. ginger 1/2 tsp. nutmeg 1/2 tsp. salt

As I have stated in the past, If I don't receive any articles for the newsletter, I will write about things that interest me... I am hopeful they interest or inspire you.

After a really stupid landing with the Skyrocket, the right wing sustained some damage. By "stupid" I mean that I slowed the airplane too much and stalled it onto the runway. Full disclosure? When I get nervous, my piloting skills go OUT THE WINDOW. And I can't even tell you WHY I was so nervous, this being the second flight of the day? ...the first being perfectly successful.

IF I had to guess, it was that ugly touch-n-go performed during flight #2 in which I almost lost the plane. That shook me up such that when it came time to land, my brain was pretty well short-circuited, leading to a terminal case of DUMB THUMBS! So WHY the dicey touch-n-go?

I finally realized that asymmetrical engine thrust was rendering ground handling a nightmare! Actually, John Casey pointed this out and recommended a rudder gyro, which I have since added. When set to Heading Hold, ground handling has improved dramatically. The gyro can compensate for uneven engine thrust much sooner than I can and take-offs are now nearly arrow straight... dittos touch-n-goes! In the air, the Skyrocket does not require a gyro to handle well.

The cold weather and work have conspired to prolong my wing repairs, but as of this writing, I'm ready for one last light coat of primer, a light wet sanding with 600 grit, then the application of yellow paint.

NOTICE both the grey and white primers (and rust colored spot putty) on the wing. You may have your own methods

of priming and painting, but what I like to do is first apply Duplicolor GREY primer. For GAS airplanes (that do not require fuel proofing against glow fuel), I am SOLD on Duplicolor primers and paints. The grey is a thicker primer that fills imperfections. After sanding the grey primer, I then apply Duplicolor WHITE primer. The white is a thinner solution with not much ability to fill, but great for revealing minor surface flaws. When final sanding the white primer, I can easily see when I have sanded through the white to the grey, which gives me a gauge on how much to continue sanding. The system seems to work and Duplicolor paints go on very well, are very opaque (good coverage), and the rattle cans come with a spray tip that is superior to what you will find on Rustoleum and Krylon paints. You can find Dupli-Color paints at auto parts stores.



You may have noticed in the first picture that the engine nacelle is no longer sporting an O.S. GT 33 gasser... After battling two issues with the engines, I elected to replace them with two DLE 40cc twins. While the O.S. gassers are good running, high quality engines, I found the vibration of two single cylinder engines to be excessive, creating a constant cowl mounting problem. The other issue is their 2,000 rpm idle. The O.S. engine specs DO indicate an oper-ating range of 2,000 to 15,000 rpm, but that idle speed results in the airplane constantly rolling on the runway; it would not sit still prior to take-off. I am hopeful the DLE twins, with a 1,500 idle spec, will RESOLVE both issues.





As much as I have tried avoid buying Chinese products, there simply was no comparable alternative offered by any of the other engine companies. That said, I must admit that these little DLE twins are GORGEOUS! The fit and finish is second to none. IF they run as good as they look, this should be a great upgrade to the aircraft. I am also hoping the engines will have what it takes to spin the Biela 18x10 3-blade props, as the O.S. 33's did not. I also spoke with a modeler who attempted to run this same prop on a DLE 35cc single, and he felt it was too much prop.
